Having recently served as Senior Development Officer for Arts Fundraising at the University of New Mexico (UNM), Bromberg brings more than 20 years of non-profit management experience to the executive director position.

As NDI-NM executive director, Bromberg will oversee the administrative staff, and will serve on several Committees of the Board of Directors. Since joining UNM in 2002, Bromberg served as Development Officer in the College of Fine Arts and Interim Associate Director of Development for the UNM Foundation where she managed a record-breaking \$43 million fundraising campaign. Previously, Bromberg spent eleven years in the Executive Office of Lebanon Valley College in Annville, PA, as a member of the Senior Management Team and Interim Executive Director. For nearly 20 years, Bromberg managed a successful independent consulting business to help clients in higher education, health care, engineering and the arts develop management and training programs, marketing strategies, and strategic planning materials. Bromberg is a member of the Board of Directors of Chamber Music Albuquerque, a Sustainer Member of the Junior League of Albuquerque, and an Editorial Advisory Committee Member of ABQ Arts.
